



#### IT CELL

The IT Cell adopted the latest technology for providing best and uninterrupted internet connectivity in the University Campus. The IT Cell uses the specific UTM/Firewall, IBM M4 Servers, L-3/L-2 Switches, managed switches, routers, bridges, indoor as well as outdoor Wi-Fi Access Points etc. for this purpose.

The Linux based Mail Server has been established in the Campus by the IT Cell to provide the Institutional e-mail accounts (i.e.test@cdlu.ac.in) to all the research scholars & staff members, and other students on request basis.

Two-tiered secured internet access to avoid unauthorized access/misuse is being provided by the IT Cell to the staff members and the students of the University. Every internet user is being allotted a unique user id and password. Further, every activity on the internet use in the University campus is being recorded by the IT Cell.

The visitors counter has been made live on the University Website for the purpose.

#### UNIVERSITY COMPUTER CENTRE

The University Computer Centre (UCC) equipped with 56 desktop sets has been established with power back up facility on the top floor of Vivekanand Library to facilitate the research scholars, students and the staff members as per their requirements. LAN has been setup in the UCC for providing internet facility and networking. There are 2 IBM servers available in UCC and latest Antivirus and Microsoft Office has been installed. Microsoft Visual Studio is also available in the University Computer Centre. IBM software SPSS Statistics Base, IBM SPSS Forecasting and IBM SPSS Regression Software have been installed for research purpose in the Centre. Typing tests are also being conducted from time to time for testing the typing skills for University employee.

#### EDP CELL

University has signed the Memorandum of Understanding with Haryana Knowledge Corporation Limited (HKCL), Panchkula, Haryana on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2016 for the implementation of the Digital University Framework in the University. The EDP Cell has implemented the Online Application System for admission in various programmes under UTDs for the academic year 2016-17. The EDP Cell is equipped with four desktops, three laser printers and three scanners for the smooth functioning of EDP Cell. 

Fully A.C. Reading Hall (24X7), Computer Lab and Periodical Section. All the reading areas of the Library are spacious, peaceful and furnished with comfortable furniture. The Library is having a rich collection of publications which include books, journals, thesis/dissertations, reports, newspapers and magazines etc. The Library also provides Reference Books including Encyclopedia, Dictionary etc. The SC/ST Book Bank with collection of 2269 books is established in the library for SC/ST students of various departments. The facility of Online Journals and database is being provided to the users by INFLIBNET through UGC Infonet Digital Library Consortium Shodh Sindhu. Inter Library Loan facility is also available through DELNET. The Wi-Fi internet connectivity is available in the Library for easy access of internet services. Further, there is an access to E-books within University campus. The concept of fully computerized Library is adopted and is in process.

A Book Exhibition was organized on 30-31, January, 2017 for procurement of books in the Vivekananda Library. Visit to World Book Fair at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi were organized by the Library during 07-15 January, 2017 by Library staff alongwith faculty members of University Teaching Departments. The purpose of this fair is to expose new and old publications to the academic community and all others, interested in books. This occasion increases reading culture and enhance popularity of printed Publications worldwide. It also gives an opportunity for visitors to have hands on approach of various publications at a single platform.

The MoU with INFLIBNET regarding membership of Shodhganga has been signed during this year.

The campus wide Wi-Fi services are being provided round the clock (24x7) in all the buildings of the University including teaching blocks, administrative block, offices, Hostels, Shopping Complex, MP Hall and all the residential quarters since January, 2016. The University Website (www.cdlu.ac.in) is being managed effectively by the Website Office. IBM software SPSS Statistics Base, IBM SPSS Forecasting and IBM SPSS Regression Software have been installed for research purpose in the Centre. Online Application System for admission in various programmes under UTDs from the academic year 2014-15. It has also implemented project of Android based Mobile Application & IVR available on Google Play Store on trial basis for providing information like results, date-sheet, etc. to the students.

24x7 Wi-Fi service is being provided by increasing the old 60 Wi-Fi points to 239 Wi-Fi points for better connectivity and smooth functioning of Wi-Fi services. Presently, 800 concurrent users can use wi-fi service and efforts are being made to handle more than 2000 concurrent users. MoU for Digital University Framework with HKCL by the University has been finalized. Further, University is in process of signing MoU with HKCL for Digital University Framework.

Muhal Fund

The services provided by the Digital University Framework of HKCL are informative functionalities to students on portal, administrative and facilitation functionalities, admission reports, statistical reports, fee management reports, time table management reports, examination reports, web portal, academics management, eligibility and registration management, examination management module, assessment data entry software, result processing and certification using centralized result processing engine.

Further, University has 213 Acres 4 Kanal 12 Marla of total area of which more than 80 Acres approximate is fully developed which include three Teaching Blocks, Two Boys Hostels, Three Girls Hostels, University Health Centre, Shopping Complex, Bank, Administrative Block and Multipurpose Hall with all sports facilities. University has its own auditorium and seminar hall, one auditorium of total seating capacity of 2000, seminar hall of seating capacity of 500 and another seminar hall of sitting capacity of 150. University has also STP and treated water is utilised for plants.


#### 7. Innovations and Best Practices

7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year

As per the requirement of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, University has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC of this University works to achieve the goal of quality enhancement and sustainance. The IQAC tried to prepare quality standards in teaching learning, research, student support services, citizen charter, physical and ICT infrastructure, promotion of teachers under CAS. M.Phil./Ph.D. Ordinances have been revised as per UGC Guidelines 2016 to improve the quality in research. Plagiarism report has been made mandatory before the submission of M.Phil./Ph.D. thesis by the research scholars.



- 1. ICT- ICT infrastructure, as an important component and the University, is committed to ensure its equitable access to all stakeholders, including students, teachers and non-teaching staff for learning, teaching, research and administrative activities. Towards this end, the University has been augmenting its ICT infrastructure to match its growing academic and administrative requirements. The University is continually extending and upgrading its ICT infrastructure with the replacement of obsolete and addition of the latest hardware and software as per the needs of the newly introduced programmes. The use of ICT is evident from the activities like campus network, augmentation of learning resources and video-conferencing facility, etc.
- 2. **Industry Integrated Approach** Several programmes like MBA, MCA, M.Tech., *etc.* of the University have been designed keeping in view the requirement of the industry. The course contents of the programmes have been structured in such a manner that the students visit the industry on and off. In some courses, industrial training of 1-2 months has been made an integral part of the course curriculum. On the completion of training, the students submit their training reports to the University for evaluation.

#### 7.4 Contribution to Environmental Awareness / Protection



- 31. The Department of Computer Science & Applications plans to organize a National Conference on Emerging Areas of Computing.
- 32. Focus will be on the strengthening of Department of Commerce in terms of human resource i.e. teaching and non-teaching staff.
- 33. The Department of English encourage ICT-based teaching, to encourage more inter department activities and plan to organize one day National Seminar.
- 34. Induction programme for the new entrants in the department.
- 35. More Legal Awareness Camps will be organized by Legal Aid Clinic of the Department of Law and department is planning to start Law Research Journal.

  - d. Atleast one activity as stated at point (c) above may be organized.
  - e. Every Counselor/Incharge should participate and motivate the students for participation in joint camp of counselors/incharges and student volunteers (two to three volunteers from each college/institution/university campus) to be organized at university level.
  - f. Every Counselor/Incharge should participate and motivate the students for participation in district level camps/state/national level camp etc. in compliance with the orders of concerned district/state authority, if any.
  - g. The YRC Unit of the university campus/college/institution will be of minimum Fifty volunteers. However, the size of the unit can be determined by the executive committee of the university campus/college/institution according to strength of the students.
  - h. YRC Unit will organize/celebrate international/national days & weeks as per convenience.
  - Some of the YRC volunteers will be deputed on First Aid Posts established during Festivals, Rallies, Sports meets etc. as trained First Aider to help the sick and wounded.
  - j. Any other activity/programme in concurrence with the Red Cross objectives.
